Approval of the terms of, and authorization for the Mayor to execute, an agreement with Ward Diesel for exhaust filters for Fire Apparatus.

Fiscal Impact:

Phase 1 of this project includes the purchase of 6 - Ward NoSmoke II Diesel Exhaust Systems at a cost of \$64,176 (\$10,696 per system). This project was approved in the Fire Department Capital Improvement Plan under Line FD-019A, Vehicles; 320-42200-977.

Contract Type:

Original Contract

Contract Term (if applicable):

Sole Source Purchase

Background:

The Fire Department is requesting approval to purchase Ward NoSmoke 2 Diesel Exhaust Filtration Systems for installation on fire apparatus. These self-contained, vehicle-mounted systems are designed to capture and filter diesel particulate matter directly at the exhaust outlet, significantly reducing firefighters' exposure to diesel emissions while apparatus are operating or idling around personnel.

These will be installed on fire apparatus which are housed at a station without a diesel exhaust removal system.

Firefighters are routinely exposed to diesel exhaust during emergency responses, training, and apparatus operations. Diesel exhaust contains fine particulate matter and other hazardous compounds that have been identified as carcinogenic and present long-term health risks. Installing diesel exhaust filtration systems on fire apparatus is a proactive measure to reduce occupational exposure, improve air quality around personnel, and support the Department's commitment to firefighter health and safety.

The Ward NoSmoke 2 system is proprietary technology manufactured exclusively by Ward Diesel Filter Systems. Because the equipment utilizes patented components that are not available from other manufacturers, the system must be purchased directly from

Ward or its authorized distributor. As a result, this purchase qualifies as a sole-source procurement.

Summary:

The Fire Department requests approval to purchase Ward NoSmoke 2 Diesel Exhaust Filtration Systems for apparatus housed at a station without an exhaust-removal system. These vehicle-mounted systems reduce firefighters' exposure to carcinogenic diesel emissions. Because the patented technology is available only from Ward or its authorized distributor, the purchase qualifies as a sole-source procurement.

Recommended Council Action:

Fire Department staff recommend approval of the sole-source purchase of Ward NoSmoke 2 Diesel Exhaust Filtration Systems in the amount of \$64,176. Funding is available within the Fire Department's approved capital budget.

Contract Term (if applicable):

The rental agreement is approximately January 30, 2027, through September 7, 2027.

Background:

The town has allocated \$75,000 for the FY27 exhibit budget. The cost for the fall exhibit has already been paid, and staff have arranged for the next exhibit rental, which is requested for six months instead of the usual three months. The exhibits remain popular among visitors and effectively support field trip curricula through STEM and related concepts.

Summary:

The staff has been collaborating with a different exhibit rental group for both the spring and summer exhibit rentals. They are requesting to rent "The Robot Zoo" for a six-month term instead of the usual three-month term starting in the spring. This extended rental period will prevent staff from needing to set up and take down an exhibit in May, which is a particularly busy time of year.

This exhibit will benefit various groups, including field trips, summer camps, party rentals, families, and other visitors. It offers an engaging learning experience about how animals function through biometrics and interactive displays.

Most of the rental cost will be covered in fiscal year 2027 (FY27), with a small portion to be paid after July 1, 2027. Given the size of the SOAC, staff has opted for the 2,500 square-foot version of the exhibit, which features three robot animals and seven hands-on activities that mimic real-life characteristics.

Recommended Council Action:

Staff recommends approval of the terms and authorization for the "The Robot Zoo" exhibit rental for the Smyrna Outdoor Adventure Center.

Background:

This is an online application that will be signed upon approval.

Summary:

This item was supposed to be approved by SWAC at the July 20th meeting. However, SWAC did not have a quorum, so the SWAC meeting was rescheduled for August 4, 2026. It only needs to be approved by Town Council.

The Annual Report compiles actions taken by the Town to maintain compliance with the 6 minimum measures of the Town's MS4 permit with the State of Tennessee. The report relays that the Town has maintained our public outreach and involvement, illicit discharge detection and elimination, construction site overview, post-construction stormwater management, good housekeeping, and stream monitoring programs.

Approval of the terms of, and authorization for the Mayor to execute, an agreement with Premier Fence to replace a handrail on the sidewalk along Rock Springs Road between Imperial Drive and the entrance to Colony Square Apartments.

Fiscal Impact:

The Town of Smyrna has a budget of \$150,000 for Sidewalk Rehabilitation to help maintain sidewalks in safe working conditions. This fiscal impact of \$19,486.16 would be paid from this fund. The option we selected is the 3 Rail Pipe - Post Inground.

Contract Type:

Original Contract

Contract Term (if applicable):

The work must begin within two months of approval of the proposal.

Background:

Since the area behind the sidewalk contains steep slopes and does not provide the required 2-foot level recovery area, a guardrail or pedestrian safety fence is needed to prevent pedestrians from accidentally stepping off the sidewalk and falling into the drainage ditch.

Summary:

The existing fence is severely deteriorated, with significant rust and structural wear. In addition, its vertical-slat design creates visibility concerns for motorists on Imperial Boulevard. As drivers approach the intersection, the slats can visually align and obstruct sight lines, reducing their ability to clearly see approaching traffic and pedestrians. Replacing the fence with a safer, more open design would improve both pedestrian protection and intersection visibility.

Recommended Council Action:

Staff recommends Town Council approve the Mayor to sign off on the agreement.

Fiscal Impact:

The Public Works Department has set aside funds from the Storm Water Fund (\$200,000) for drainage repairs that arise in various locations throughout town in account 320-43900-945

Contract Type:

Original Contract

Contract Term (if applicable):

The term of this contract is for 12 months from the date of execution. There is an automatic renewal clause at the end of each term for a further 3 years unless either party gives the other written notice of termination at least 30 days prior to the end of the relevant term.

Background:

The Public Works Department periodically requires the repair, maintenance, rehabilitation, and construction of existing and new stormwater conveyance infrastructure. This contract provides an on-call mechanism for procuring qualified contractor services to perform these activities as needed, allowing the Town to address operational, maintenance, and capital improvement requirements in a timely and efficient manner.

Summary:

This contract is for repair, maintenance, and construction of headwalls, storm pipes, manholes, etc.

Background:

The Legal Department is responsible for acquiring the real property interests, such as construction easements, required for Town infrastructure projects. Occasionally, the acquisition process results in litigation. While these lawsuits are typically managed in-house, the Stewart Creek Gravity Sewer project involves around 140 property tracts. Additionally, the deadline for property acquisitions on this project is June 2027. To prevent the Town Attorney's office from being overwhelmed by the anticipated volume of litigation, we are seeking to retain E. Evan Cope, LLC to handle all lawsuits associated with these project acquisitions. E. Evan Cope, LLC currently provides these same services under similar retainer agreements for the cities of Murfreesboro and Lavergne. They have a strong reputation for delivering prompt, reliable, and high-quality work, and their proposed fee schedule aligns with current market rates in the area.

Summary:

This contract retains E. Evan Cope Law Office to handle land acquisition lawsuits for the Stewart Creek Gravity Sewer Project.

The Town historically spends approximately \$10,000 in pest control services across all facilities. Service charges are budgeted by department and charged based on usage. The new contract pricing is estimated to increase this expense by \$2-3k, which is anticipated to be covered by the current FY27 budget.

Contract Term (if applicable):

The quoted price list is effective for 24 months, with two optional 1-year extensions. Quoted prices can be found in Section III of the attached Wayne's Pest Control Bid & Agreement.

Background:

Departments can elect to be on a monthly treatment list and are charged according to services requested. Wayne's Pest Control is the current vendor.

Summary:

Although the existing contract allowed for an extension, Wayne's Pest Control was unable to renew at the current price. A bid for pest control services was advertised on June 9, 2026, and the following vendors were directly notified of the opportunity: Ferrell's One Stop Exterminating, Ken's Exterminating, Terminix Commercial, Cook's Pest Control, Ameri Care Services, Wayne's Pest Control, Marigold Pest Control, US Pest Protection, Mean Green Pest Pros, Middle TN Exterminating, and Presto X.

The Town received one sealed bid from Wayne's Pest Control, which opened June 23, 2026.

The primary rates are increasing from \$25-\$28 per location to \$35. The May 2023 bid list is provided as a reference.

Background:

The property that is the subject of this request is located at 10510 Old Nashville Highway, approximately 500 feet northwest of the intersection with Pioneer Drive/Stewart Vally Drive. The Land Use Plan would support Medium Density Residential development in this immediate area, with nearby areas being located within the Old Nashville Corridor character area which would support a mix of neighborhood scale retail uses and personal services that provide markets for local customers.

Townhomes, attached residential development, and other multifamily uses are also appropriate. The surrounding zoning is R-1, C-2, and PRD (Villas at Stewartsboro).

Summary:

There is an existing house and detached accessory structure on this property. A sewer line is stubbed into the property from the northwest in two locations. Water is provided by Consolidated Utility District. If this rezoning is approved, a Type C buffer would be required where this property borders residentially zoned properties when it is developed.

Unknown at this time. The Town currently collects \$200k from Comcast and \$20k-\$30k from both Google Fiber and AT&T annually. TDS Telecom is a smaller entity and not expected to gross more revenue than the current agreements; therefore, annual estimates would be \$20k or less.

Contract Term (if applicable):

Background:

TCA 7-59-301 allows cable and video service providers to apply for a state-issued certificate of franchise authority. This certificate requires the submission of a written description of the municipalities to be served. Section C-8 requires the Provider to also notify these local governments of their right to assess franchise fees.

Summary:

On June 23, 2026 the Town received notice of TDS Telecom's application to amend its state-issued Certificate of Franchise Authority to include the Town of Smyrna. The Town most recently entered into an agreement with Google; this resolution aligns with Google's 2% assessment.

Summary:

The Town of Smyrna Planning Department completed the extensive fee study required by HB 0375 / SB 0988. It was determined that several fees currently exceeded the actual cost. Although the Town is not required to lower these fees, staff recommends adjusting the fee amount to reflect actual labor costs. Pages 4 and 5 of the attached Fee Table Justification document provide additional information for these changes. Both the Final Plat and Preliminary Plat Subdivision fees are now a flat fee; the "per lot" portion will be removed.

Ordinance #26-33, approved at the July Council Meeting, established the Property Owner 30-Day Mobile Food Vendor Permit.

Background:

Cybersecurity is a top concern for the Town of Smyrna. Disclosure of information related to the vendors, products and services used for security purposes can minimize their effectiveness by allowing adversaries the ability to attempt known exploits. Maintaining the confidentiality of this information will help maintain our security posture. The Town can protect this information through approval of this resolution.

Summary:

Tenn. Code Ann. §10-7-504(i)(3)(C). Authorizes the governing body of a municipality, by resolution, the identity of cybersecurity vendors to be confidential.

Recommended Council Action:
